

Classic Windows

LT McGuinness asked us to replace the shaped windows in the Odlins Building. These had to match existing windows and the sashes all needed to line up and look the same. We took up the challenge and the work was put into the hands of our



resident expert, Tony, to layout, laminate and prepare for shaping the windows. These had to be 150mm in depth so required three pieces of timber laminated together and joined in six pieces to form the basic arch shape. The arches were then marked out ready for cutting to size.

It was then over to Kerry to ensure that they were cut to the marked shape and finished to the sizes required for each opening. It was critical that the finished sizes matched as there was only a 5mm tolerance allowed for fitting. With Dasi's help an awkward heavy job was completed with the minimum of effort.



They were then ready to have the sashes made, fitted, sanded and primed ready for delivery to site. Eight windows later, the largest being five metres long certainly made an impressive load.

They were then transported to the Odlins site for LT McGuinness contractors to install. I am pleased to say that they fitted like a glove, which was testament to a job well done and executed to perfection.
